Bibliography Format: DO NOT LOSE THIS PAPER!!!

Bibliography:

“A list of source materials that are used or consulted in the preparation of a work or that are referred to in a text.” Basically a list of all the books, magazines, newspaper articles, web-sites, encyclopedias, dictionaries, etc... that you use to find your information. Everything you read to gain information must be included on a bibliography, as this information did not come from your own head, even if you put it in your own words. The bibliography entry for the quote above would look like this:

“Bibliography.” Def. 2. Dictionary.com. Random House, Inc. 2006.

A few important things:

1. Each section is divided by a period.
2. The first line starts at the margin, the second (and all other lines) are indented (basically the opposite of a paragraph)
3. When you do a bibliography, list them alphabetically by the first word of each entry.
4. If you can't find any of the information below, skip it, do not write unknown or anonymous, just go to the next category
5. **Always list the bibliography while you are using the source, it is much harder to go back and find it again, and a waste of time**

Below is the format and examples for the most common resources used by students.

For a web-site: *(by the way Google is not a web-site it is a search engine, list the name of the site you visit, not the search engine you use).*

Author. “Title of Article, Web page or site”. Title of Magazine, Journal, Newspaper, Newsletter, Book, Encyclopedia, or Project. Editor of Project. Date of web-page either creation or last update. Group responsible for web-site. Access date. <complete Uniform Resource Locator (URL)>.

Example:
